CLASSROOM POLICIES

I. General Procedures - Conduct

- A. Be in class and in your assigned seat when the tardy bell rings.
- B. You will not leave your seat without the permission of the teacher. This includes the end of the class period......I dismiss you from class, the bell does not.
- C. Hall passes will be issued for emergencies only.
- D. You are required to bring all necessary materials to class each day (pen, pencil, notebook, paper, etc.).
- E. You will listen when someone else is speaking, showing respect for each other and the teacher.
- F. You will raise your hand and wait to be called on before speaking.
- G. Follow directions the <u>first</u> time they are given.
- H. You will keep your hands and feet to yourselves and respect the space of others.
- I. All class materials will be kept in their designated areas.
- J. You will not eat or drink in class.
- K. You will follow the school dress code: no electronic games, hats, cards, or radios will be permitted in class. **Cell phone use in class is strictly prohibited. NO TEXTING.**
- L. You will not apply makeup, polish nails, or comb hair in class.
- M. You are to remain alert and on task at all times: sleeping or putting your head down on the desk is unacceptable behavior.
- N. All work to be turned in must have a title, your name, class period, and date in order to receive credit.

O. All homework must be turned in at the beginning of the class period.

II. Consequences for Breaking Rules

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1st time = warning
2nd time = 30 minute detention after school, parent contact.
3rd time = 60 minute detention after school, referral to counselor, and parent contact.
4th time = parents will be called and student will be referred to assistant principal
severe = immediate referral to assistant principal
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Refusal to serve detention will result in added detention time, a call to your parents, and in repeated cases, a parent /student/counselor conference will be scheduled.

Good behavior and a positive attitude will be rewarded.

III. Attendance

- A. Students not in their seats when the final bell rings will be counted tardy.
- B. Make-up assignments must be <u>requested by the student</u> when the student has been absent.
- C. 5 bonus points will be rewarded for perfect attendance during any eligible week.

IV. Grading

- A. Your grade will be based on quizzes, tests, laboratories, homework, class work, projects, and participation.
- B. A pop quiz may be given any time during the class period based on current class topics. This will count as a single grade.
- C. Quizzes will count as a single or double grade depending on the nature of the quiz.
- D. Tests will count as four grades.
- E. Most laboratory assignments will count as a single grade; however, some of the more demanding labs will count as multiple grades. You will be given

advance notice of any multiple graded labs.

- E2. Approximately 25-30 letter grades will be issued per grading period (all grading categories combined).
- F. Homework will be checked each day an assignment is due. Full credit (20 points), half credit (10 points), partial credit (5 points), or a zero will be given. Outstanding effort will result in additional bonus points. You will receive a letter grade each time 5 consecutive homework assignments are collected. Any bonus points earned during this 5 assignment period will be added to your point total. Grades will be assigned according to this scale:

A+ = (100+) points A = (90 - 100) points B = (80 - 89) points C = (70 - 79) points D = (60 - 69) points F = (0 - 59) points

- G. You must do all of the following three things in order to pass this class:
 - 1. Have good attendance.
 - 2. Do all (or most) of your work.
 - 3. Pass most tests, quizzes, and laboratories.

V. Homework (make-up)

- A. Whenever you are absent (excused), you will have a two-day grace period (for each day of absence) to turn in make-up work. If your absence is unexcused, you will receive an F for each day of that absence and work cannot be made up for credit.
- B. Homework may be turned in no more than two days late for half-credit. After that, no credit will be given.
